Doing What You Can by: David McDonald

Mary, the sister of Martha and Lazarus had just broken a bottle, of what would have amounted to over \$850 in 2008, of perfume and poured it over Jesus Christ's head (Mk. 14:3-9; Matt. 26:6-13; Jn. 12:1-9). This was a perfume highly esteemed and would have been appreciated by any woman of class (and perhaps those with less). It was an especially costly perfume and very aromatic, extremely pleasant to smell. Yet, she had taken this expensive luxury and poured all of it on the head of Jesus. The three gospel writers recording this event state the indignation was evident among some, if not all of the disciples. John names the ring leader of the discontent as Judas. This same Judas, named by John, would betray the Lord later for what amounted to approximately \$200.

With this expression of extreme displeasure being pointed against this woman, Jesus, says, "*Let her alone . . . she has done what she could*" (Mk. 14:8). That is really all any of us could ever want our Lord to say about us, "You have done what you could." The burning question we must ask ourselves, "Am I doing what I can?" Earlier, a widow had given the smallest of amounts to the treasury, yet Jesus had stated she had given more than all the others because she had given sacrificially, out of her poverty, while the others had just given what amounted to expendable income.

There is so much to be done in the Lord's kingdom. There is so much work to be accomplished right here in His body, the church. Will He say about me, "They have done what they can do?" Paul talks about the importance of each member of the body doing its part so the whole body can function most effectively. Paul goes on to say, there is absolutely no one part of the body any more important than any other part (1 Cor. 12:12-27). There are no more important jobs in the Lord's kingdom if each one is doing what each one can. In the end, it does not matter whether one is a five talent person or a two talent person. What matters is that whatever talent, or talents, you possess you are to do what you can with that talent (Matt 25:14-30). Ask yourself the question, "Am I doing what I can?" If not, why not? If not, start today. Find what you can do. If you cannot find something, ask someone. The field of work is plentiful (Matt. 9:37). Do what you can.
