In Search Of A Real Mother

“But seek ye first the kingdom of God, and his righteousness; and all these things shall be added unto you.” Matthew 6:33

Each has their own definition of mother or motherhood. No doubt they are all good and speak to the qualities of the great women of our lives. One profound and insightful explanation of a mother was given by *Tenneva Jorden*, “A mother is a person who seeing there are only four pieces of pie for five people, promptly announces she never did care for pie.”

One of the more familiar narratives in the Bible is where Solomon was called to determine the identity of the true mother. As you remember, one mother’s child died and the other was alive. They both claimed the living child to be theirs. Solomon had sought the wisdom of God to govern His people (1Kings 3). God must have answered his request. The two women were brought before him and he proposed to settle the dispute by cutting the living child in half and giving each woman half a child in an effort to satisfy both. When appealing to the instincts of a mother’s love, the real mother forfeited her right to the child to insure the child’s life. A mother’s love is a rally to the “call of duty.” She will risk her own life to protect her offspring.

Love— Describes the motive behind a mother’s devotion. This is a love that looks to the best interests of the object of that love. This is

the love that God has for His children (Rom. 5:8; 1 Jn. 4:10, 19). This love forfeits the last piece of pie, best cuts of meat, or even self-deprivation.

Discipline— is a part of the way a mother expresses her love. Is the pulling of the ear necessary? What about the thump on the head when a child turns mouthy? No restraint causes chaos and declares “hate” for her child (Pro. 13:24).

Wisdom — is a gift from above (Jas. 1:5) and usually comes by means of life’s experiences. The very giving of birth to us reminded her that most of the blessings of life are found in the midst of struggle, pain and opposition. Mothers can provide a wealth of wisdom to all with whom she has to do if only given the privilege to benefit. Her wisdom and love came from heaven.

Training— is “OJT” or “on the Job Training.” It was mother who taught us to tie our shoe, read the Bible, to pray, eat right things, make our bed, to brush our teeth, and so many more worthwhile behaviors.

If your mother is still living, tell her of your love and say “thanks!” If your mother is dead, activate those principles for which she lived and died in your life and honor her in so doing. Happy Mother’s Day!

Haiti Relief Update
April 25, 2010

Over the last month our relief effort in Haiti has begun to take on a more sustainable form. Plans have been made which we hope will allow us to not only meet current urgent needs, but also build for a better future for the church in and around Port au Prince.

In mid-March our annual spring break medical campaign was restructured to provide a major medical clinic and Bible School at our group house in Santo. Hundreds of people were transported in from other congregations, and over 2,000 were treated in the clinic. Everyone who came through the clinic participated in a basic Bible class, and dozens attended VBS each evening for all ages, including adults. The Santo congregation had over 300 in attendance while our group was there, which has been consistently the case since the earthquake.

In order to relieve Roberta of the strain of receiving and distributing tons of food, we have asked a committee of church leaders to accept the responsibility of purchasing and distributing food in bulk. These brothers have agreed to provide accounting for all that they do, and they believe that they will be able to distribute about \$32,000 worth of food each month. This will not only provide food, but will provide opportunities for these men to learn accountability and cooperation.

We have also offered to help several congregations either rebuild or purchase suitable property for the churches. We are suggesting to them that these properties could be used not only for worship, but also as Christian schools. Many of the preachers and church members already make their living as teachers or school administrators. We are hopeful that this will create jobs as well as make contacts for the churches. Healing Hands International has offered to drill wells at these sites in order to further enhance public relations.

Many bottlenecks have been removed over the last month, and we hope that a month from now our capacity to help is even greater. Over 2,000 people or congregations have sent funds to Estes for earthquake relief. We are working on a formal, quarterly financial report to be released in the next few weeks. (An external auditor will review this report.) In brief, however, I will mention that we have distributed about \$370,000 in aid thus far. 74% of that went for food, medicine, tarps, and other forms of temporary aid. 13% has been spent sending in strategic teams of emergency workers. The remaining 13% has been spent on reconstruction and equipment (such as a heavier truck for handling supplies). Over \$2.3M has been received, leaving almost \$2M on hand. This generosity will allow us to help for at least a year longer, possibly two, as well as providing for some capital purchases as described above.

A large number of people have volunteered to go and work in Haiti. We are concerned, however, about the workload that this places on Roberta. Therefore, we are trying to match personnel with needs so that we provide the right kind of support. The show of love and support has been very encouraging to us and to Roberta.
