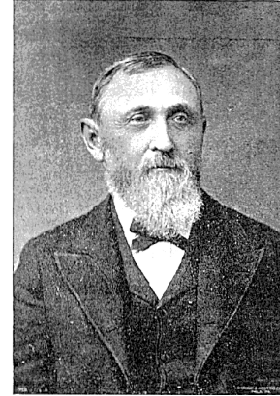

## COMBAT AND FELLOWSHIP ARE OPPOSITES

The year 2006 marked the centennial of the official split between the Christian Church and the Churches of Christ. The primary difference then and now is instrumental music in worship. A couple of stories about *J.W. McGarvey* are presented below so we may learn what they learned too late.

*William Woodson* recounts the following history in the May 5, 1996 issue of *Vigil* about *J.W. McGarvey*, a writer and preacher about 100 years ago. “First, it was recalled that in the early 1870’s, with the knowledge and approval of *J.W. McGarvey* as one of the elders, a small instrument was placed in the basement of the building of the Lexington, KY, Broadway Christian Church to be used by the young people in improving their singing. No one, especially *McGarvey*, would have thought of, let alone approved, moving the instrument upstairs to be used in the worship services.”

“Years went by; the youngsters grew up and took their places in the church. And so it occurred that in November 1902 a move was made to introduce instrumental music into the worship services, and *McGarvey’s* sensitive conscience in this matter forbade his remaining with the Broadway church. The vote was taken – 370 for and 202 against – meant that what had been refused a few years before was allowed, and the *McGarveys* went elsewhere.”

“One may admire *McGarvey’s* action on principle in 1902, but that allowance and approval of the organ in the basement in the early 1870’s remains a troubling fact. It is not known how many youngsters who had been trained in singing with the organ in the basement voted for the organ in the worship, but the likelihood is that few who were so trained voted against its use in 1902.”

Brother *McGarvey* told *Jesse P. Sewell* in Jan. of 1903 before speaking at the Bryan Street church of Christ in Dallas, TX: “You are on the right road, and whatever you do, do not let anybody persuade you that you can successfully combat error by fellowshiping it and going along with it. I have tried. I believed at the start that was the only way to do it...it will not work.”

We must sometimes say “no” because of the negative influence it can have on future generations. We must not fellowship wrong or churches that do wrong! Unauthorized worship is always wrong. We must abstain from wrong, but also the very appearance of wrong (I Thess. 5:21-22).
