Cannibals On The Prowl

The story is told of an infidel visiting the Fiji Islands who spoke critically of the elderly chief. He said, “You’re a great leader, but it’s a pity you’ve been taken in by those foreign missionaries. No one believes the Bible anymore. People are tired of the threadbare story of Christ dying on the cross for the sins of the world. They know better now. I’m sorry you’ve been so foolish as to accept their story.”

The old chief’s eyes flashed as he answered, “See that great rock over there? On it we smashed the heads of our victims. Notice the furnace next to it? In that oven, we formerly roasted the bodies of our enemies. If it hadn’t been for those good missionaries and the love of Jesus that changed us from cannibals unto Christians, you’d never leave this place alive! You’d better thank the Lord for the gospel; otherwise we would already be feasting on you. If it weren’t for the Bible, you would now be our supper.”

Our initial response to this story is that we find it humorous. When we examine it in the light of spiritual understanding, we learn that we may be surrounded by cannibalism that gnaws at our spiritual integrity and faith. The **cannibal of emotionalism** is eating at the very foundations of truth and true righteousness. The Christian life is characterized as having many emotions, but that must not be the primary objective for worship and service. When truth and good judgment are “eaten alive” from our understanding and response to God, apostasy lurks in the not too distant future. The **cannibal of liberalism** declares that the gospel must be updated, having no place in the pulpit, and refusing to use its terms to describe sin and the end result of a godless life. To the liberal, it is inappropriate to stress the plan of salvation at the close of the sermon. There is a **cannibal of apathy and indifference** that perpetually “eat away” at the Christian, prompting him to overlook religious differences between us and our religious neighbors. He declares that the church has failed and that “organized religion” is a thing of the past.

A major concern for Paul was that the brethren “...bite and devour one another, take heed that ye be not consumed one of another” (Gal. 5:15). The Devil epitomizes cannibalism in that he “walks about seeking whom he may devour” (1 Pet. 5:8).

It is not uncommon when we have something troubling us for someone to say, “What’s eating you?” If you are spiritually troubled, I would simply ask, “What’s eating you?”

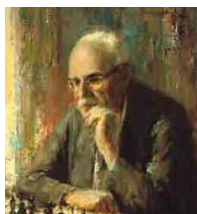
